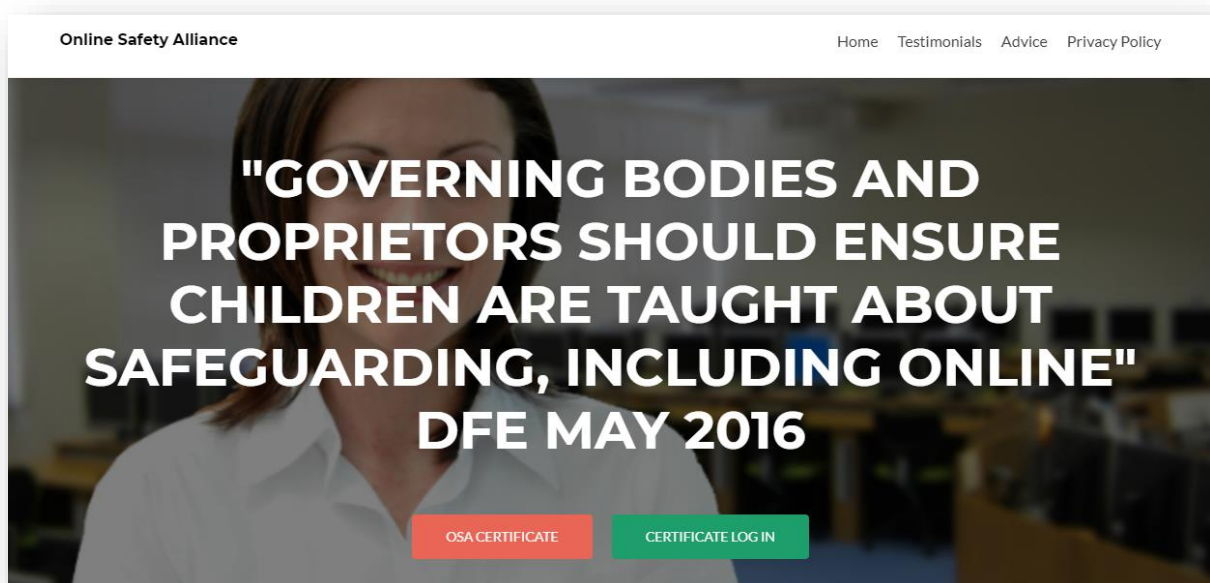


1. Getting started:

Please visit www.onlinesafetyalliance.org and select the green 'Certificate Log In' button on the home page:



2. Logging in

Please select the option to log in using a Google or Microsoft account. In most cases, your school email address will be linked to either Google or Microsoft accounts. Using your school email in this way should provide you with access to the OSA system without needing to create a new account.



Snapchat: Areas of concern
Online abuse

The transient nature of messages on Snapchat has made it a popular medium for abuse such as online bullying as abusers feel they will not be held to account for messages posted once they are deleted. This is supported by the fact that if somebody takes a screenshot of a message posted on Snapchat then the person who posted it is informed that this has happened, making it more uncomfortable for people to take evidence of abuse they have suffered or witnessed.
